## Term dates 25-26 consultation – message from Chris Hill CEO

The local authority (NNC) has now published their term dates for 2025-26 so it is time for us to decide on our own for the schools within the trust. In previous years we have consulted whether we as a Multi Academy Trust (who can set our own term dates) should continue to follow the NNC pattern or set our own.

I was very conscious that this year the term before Christmas was a long one which inevitably takes its toll on staff and children. As we are a peoplefocussed organisation, I am mindful of everyone's wellbeing and consider it is now time to review whether we can spread our terms better. Inevitably public holidays, Easter and Christmas timings have an impact, so it is never going to be perfect.

Although we have set term dates for 2024/25 aligned to NNC and there are a couple of long terms in there, it is too late now to change tack as I appreciate people will have already made plans this year and into next year.

However, for 2025/26 I would like some feedback on whether we could have a two week October half term and have a longer Summer term in July. I have prepared a very short 2-question survey that asks if you want to keep to the NNC dates for 2025-26 or change to this new model. 

#### Park Tooth Fairy....!

Community Dental Services have been contracted by North Northamptonshire County Council to carry out the National 5-year-old dental survey this year and next year. We have to carry out this



survey on behalf of Public Health England every 2 years.


This year it is more important than ever that schools and children selected to participate in the survey do so to help us start to understand the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on children's dental health.

Community Dental Services will carry out the dental examinations in Raunds Park Infant School following government advice that aligns with national guidance for schools and infection prevention and control measures.

The dental practitioners use a plastic mirror to check the teeth and record what they see. They will only see those children with consent from their parents/guardians. Everything that will be reordered is confidential and will not identity any children that have taken part in the survey.

Once we have checked the children's teeth the team will hand out letters to the school team to hand out to the parents informing them of how their child's teeth check went and whether they need take further action. The children will also get a sticker at the end of their examination.

Our date is the 13<sup>th</sup> February for anyone who is five or over in the school. Permission letters will be sent to youwatch out for more information coming soon!
