We went to the church and we learned about and practiced a baptism. We learned all about the water in the church and the water going over the baby.








What did we learn?

St Peter's will be learning all about the Christian value of forgiveness and how it can be used to live a happy and fulfilling life. There are many examples in the Bible where forgiveness is


demonstrated, and we will be learning how to be more forgiving and understanding of others this term.


Any help you can give with pre-teaching these values with your children would be really beneficial and I hope this enables you to have some brilliant family conversations at home too!




